The Moroccan intellectual and national liberation leader Mehdi Ben Barka disappeared in 1965 after being picked up by the French police in Paris. After his disappearance the official account was that nothing was known about the incident; but the involvement of the criminal world together with the French police tells a different story. *In French, with English subtitles*.
